Pursuant to the Court's March 11, 2013 Order Staying Further Proceedings, the ment of Ecology (Ecology) and City of Leavenworth (Leavenworth) submit this Initial tatus Report.

Icicle Creek Comprehensive Water Resource Strategy. Ecology's Office of Columbia River (OCR) and the Chelan County Department of Natural Resources (Chelan-DNR) co-hosted a workshop of Icicle Creek sub-basin stakeholders on December 4-5, 2012. Among the purposes of the workshop was to engage the stakeholders in identifying water-saving and water management projects that will improve instream flows and water availability in the Icicle Creek sub-basin. Leavenworth and other stakeholders, sometimes referred to as the Icicle Working Group, have since participated in follow-

- up workshops on March 7 and July 8, 2013. A draft Icicle Integrated Project List dated May 17, 2013 is included as Attachment A.
- 2. <u>Identification of Water-Saving Projects</u>. Project scoping and feasibility has not been completed by the Icicle Working Group, but Chelan-DNR is making progress on a scope of work to engineer one or more of the projects, including the restoration of permitted storage on Eight-Mile Lake by Icicle Irrigation District. After additional project scoping and preliminary engineering, Ecology and Leavenworth will meet to determine which project or projects will provide the best prospects for leading to a settlement in this case, along with other potential benefits to the Icicle sub-basin.
- 3. Funding and Permitting of Water-Saving Projects. Until the previous step is completed, it is premature to move forward with actions to fund and obtain permits. However, preliminary analysis by Ecology-OCR, Chelan-DNR and Leavenworth indicates that the Eight-Mile Lake project has potential to be funded along with several other projects within the Icicle sub-basin that would provide a path towards settlement in this case.
- Transfer of Water Rights to City of Leavenworth. Until funding and permitting of a
 project is completed, it is premature to move forward with actions to transfer water
 rights to Leavenworth.
- 5. <u>Court Assistance with Settlement Process</u>. At this point, the parties do not believe that the assistance of the Court is necessary.
- 6. Request for Settlement Conference. Neither party is requesting a settlement conference with the Court at this time.
- 7. Next Status Report. The parties will submit the next joint status report in six months, on or before March 12, 2014.
